About this Service

Pentecost

Pentecost, celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday, is one of the principal feasts of The Episcopal Church, and is commonly regarded as the birthday of the broader Christian Church. On this day, as described in the reading from Acts appointed for the Day of Pentecost, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit—the third person of the Trinity—to his disciples, as he had foretold in his teaching. As is common with many feast days pertaining to Jesus' apostles, it is customary to wear red vestments to symbolize the "tongues, as of fire" that inspired them to preach the Gospel in other languages.

Pentecost is also one of the four holy days (along with the Easter Vigil, The Baptism of Our Lord, and All Saints' Day) especially suitable for Holy Baptism, as well as for confirmation, reception, and reaffirmation: sacramental rites which can only be performed by a bishop. Today we welcome the Rt. Rev. Mary D. Glasspool, Assistant Bishop of New York, to preach and preside as these new and renewing Christians join Trinity Church.



We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

Each Candidate comes to the font with their Parents, Godparents, or Sponsors, and is presented by name to the Vicar. The Vicar pours water upon the Candidate.




